1	Welcome and Apologies for Absence	Members present: Keith Brown (KB), Sue Clark (SC), Chris Dean (CD), Sam Down (SD), Celia Ellacott (CE), Tony Hooper (TH), John Lloyd (JL), Virginia Pike (VP), Emma Sellick (ES), Roger Willis (RW), in person. Tim Chown (TC, Secretary), by Skype. Apologies received: Sue Clark (SC), Andy Symons (AS)	
2	Matters Arising from previous meeting	KB acted as chair in the absence of AS and opened the meeting at 11.15am. The minutes of 23 rd February 2019 had already been approved by email. RW and VP arrived at 11.17am.	
3	Membership Secretary's Report (RW)	RW reported that the AFT still has around 400 members, with junior numbers also still the same. TC raised the issue of the renewal process and that we should ensure all members are written to as a reminder for renewal, if they do not automatically renew. Action: RW, TC, JL to discuss and document the process and organise written letters of renewal. TC offered to help by printing and posting letters; at present this would only be 30-40 at most each month. It was agreed that everyone should review the renewal letters on the AFT shared drive. JL presented his Associate Membership proposal. The general idea is that it would be a free category of membership, but without any membership benefits; it would act as a means for the AFT to remain in touch with supporters, should a need arise. JL suggested we should allow all past (lapsed) members to take a free membership – by writing to them to offer a one-off yes / no / forget (from our database) option to become an Associate Member (AM). While we have a legitimate interest to communicate, GDPR states that an opt-in is the right thing to do.	TC, RW, JL



		We need to check that InTouch can have different membership classes. Action: RW to ask InTouch.	RW
		TH asked how we distinguish between associate and full members and pointed out that we might lose full members to free membership. The pros and cons are detailed in John's AM proposal document. Regardless, we need clearer benefits to full members of the Trust anyway.	
		Need to be clear about different memberships, collecting data.	
		The meeting agreed that we would progress with the AM scheme, but that we first need to clearly define full member benefits, and then the distinction to the AM level. TH pointed out that increasing fee-paying membership is our top priority.	ALL
		We might choose to offer affiliate company memberships at a later date.

		Two card companies have offered options for card payments. One example gives a mobile terminal package, no join fee, but £21 pcm, a 0.9% fee on each transaction, and a 12-month contract. VP to make a recommendation for next meeting.	VP
		RW suggested a mutual society who may be able to help, like a credit union.	
		VP will visit the GTs on Monday at 5.45pm to pay the £1,000 contribution to the new supporters' bar.	VP
