		The GTs have reported that they now have all money they need.	
		The Trust's financial year end is 31st May. TC reminded the board that the AR30 needs to be completed and returned by December and presented at the AGM beforehand (by the end of November).	
5	Secretary's Report (TC)	TC had no matters to report.

		RW suggested the AFT holds a music gig. He knows of two mad keen Argyle fans in local bands. RW to explore further. The gig could be free to members, or £10 with a free membership; the finances for such an event would need to be checked.	RW
		It was also suggested that we could think bigger, with more well-known acts.	
7	Social Media Update (ES)	ES reported on the Easter Giftaway on FaceBook and other platforms, which went well.	
		The Ryan Taylor shirt we received from our player sponsorship proved popular. All prizes are being given at the AFT table before the match today. ES will take photos.	ES
		All social media channels have growing membership.	
		We have had an offer for an AFT YouTube channel; ES to follow up.	ES
		It is important that we convert interest into memberships.	
		Tony Cannan is keen to help out again. All agreed that we should discuss this with him over the close season. We have one place on the board for a co-optee, perhaps to help project manage specific Trust projects, such as the 'fan zone' idea that Tony previously put forward.	



		TC reminded everyone that we need web site stories, which can then be used to re-instate the regular AFT newsletter. It just needs a couple of paragraphs for a story, ideally with a photo. We could also have a paper newsletter at the AFT table. We could also have a photo competition, e.g., of Argyle fans on holidays in their Argyle shirts, and present these online and put up on a board at the AFT table.	
8	Communications and Marketing sub-group (CE, CD, SD, JL)	CE reported that the fanzines are going well. We sold out the copies we took to Accrington. AS has 31 in car, plus 8 with VP, out of 200 printed. This meant we had £161 in, against £175 print costs. Everyone welcomed the success of the fanzine and agreed that it should continue. ES will seek feedback on social media about the slightly reduced page count. We have quite a few old fanzines. It was suggested that samples could be sent out with new membership packs. CE suggested that we have AFT Christmas cards. She will approach Robby with a view to sell them in November.	ES
9	Governance subgroup report (KB, TC, TH)	KB presented his proposal to amend the AFT's standing orders, including clarifying the procedures around email / electronic meetings and voting, and on any declarations of interests. He showed an example form for new proposals. All agreed to the changes. AS thanked KB and asked that he finalise the proposal, adding extra text on the chair setting a deadline for email votes and calling the result. TC will then check and do final approval of the new rules. TC will consider how we keep associated papers online along with the minutes; at present these are not included. TH is looking at the club's governance. The Articles of Association are at Companies House. Tony will produce notes for the next meeting. He has also been meeting with the Club Secretary. It was noted that while there is an interest with many supporters in the total playing budget, it seems that there is also a not insignificant non-playing staff bill.	KB TC TH
